From Pediatrics to Adulthood: A Multidisciplinary Approach to Transitioning Transplant Care

There are several critical aspects related to the successful transition of pediatric solid organ transplant recipients to adult care, requiring a collaborative effort from the multi-disciplinary team involved. During this discussion, we will review a specific case study that illustrates how challenging the transition can be and demonstrates how each role - including pediatric psychology, social work, and medicine - works together to move patients and families through the transition process.

At the end of the webinar, participants should be able to:

- Identify aspects of transition readiness and transition to adult care unique to solid organ transplant recipients, and how multi-disciplinary medical teams can support adolescent and young adult patients and their families.
- Describe the role of pediatric psychology in supporting the transition to adult care, including promoting developmentally appropriate allocation of treatment responsibility, adherence and self-management, and overall psychosocial adjustment.
- Explain how transition readiness affects medical outcomes in solid organ transplant recipients and how medical providers can promote transition readiness in the context of multi-disciplinary clinics.
- Describe the role of social work in promoting transition in the lung transplant program, including highlighting common social determinants of health and resources available to solid organ transplant recipients.
